HOW TO CITE A BOOK IN PRINT

Last, F. M. (Year of publication). *Title of work: Start subtitle with capital letter*. Location: Publisher.

Galinsky, E. (2010). *Mind in the making: The seven essential life skills every child needs*. New York, NY: Harper Studio.

In-Text citation: (Galinsky, 2010)

HOW TO CITE A WEBSITE WITH NO AUTHOR

Organization or Institution's name. (Year). Title of article or page heading. Retrieved from <http://xyz.org/xx.xxx/yyyy>

In-Text citation: (CDC/National Center, 2016)

HOW TO CITE PODCASTS, VIDEOS, OTHER MULTIMEDIA

Last, F.M. (Year, Month day). *Title of article* [podcast/ video file/ etc....]. Retrieved from <http://xyz.org/xx.xxx/yyyy>

Cohn, G. (2014, February 13). *Why Marry?(Part 1): A new Freakonomics radio podcast* [Audio podcast]. Retrieved from <http://freakonomics.com/podcast/why-marry-part-1-a-new-freakonomics-radio-podcast/>

In-Text citation: (Cohn, 2014)

**You may substitute a screen name if the writer's name is unknown*

1. For newspaper, magazine, or journal articles with no author, **start with the article title**
2. Use **n.d.** if there is no date
3. If there is no author for a website (and it is not a newspaper/magazine/journal article), **start with the organization or institution name of the website**
4. Alphabetize the reference list by the first author's last name or institution name
